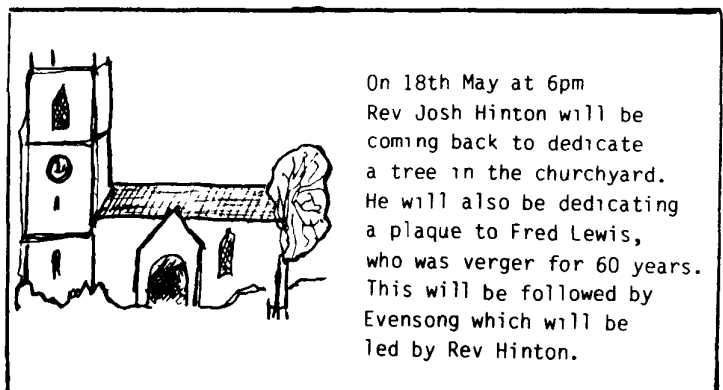


## SUMMER HOLIDAYS PLAYScheme

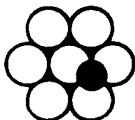

## PARISH COUNCIL

The new play equipment has now been ordered for the Recreation Field and Parkfield Play Area and will be erected in the next few weeks.

The Burial Ground Gate has now been moved to bring it in line with the entrance to the old churchyard, the stone wall will be repaired in the near future.

A letter has been sent to the Omnibus Co asking what arrangements are being made for the bus service through Shortwood to Bristol when the proposed Ring Road has been established. The Council has also asked the Bus Co to consider running a Mini Bus from Bristol to Pucklechurch at a late hour as the last bus at the moment leaves Bristol at 5.15pm.

The AGM will be held this year on Tuesday 20th May at 8pm in the Village Hall.

The Council has agreed to give a grant of £330 towards this years Holiday Play Scheme in August.

It has been decided that no further street lights are necessary during the coming year as the present lighting in the Parish is of a very good standard.

We have several untidy places and roads around the village which a lot of people grumble about and leave it at that.

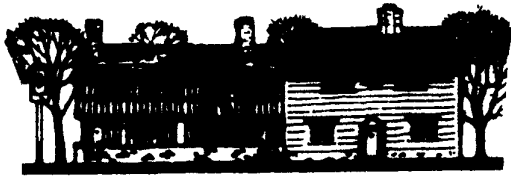
Having done a little last year through the W.I. and Brownies, why don't we try to make a bit more effort this year. It will not take much time if we get plenty of help.

# DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT - George Conrad



Concessionary Travel Tokens - up to £10 per pensioner! After mounting pressure on the District Council, we have agreed to raise the value of the Travel Tokens from £6 (unchanged for the last 6 years) to £10. Still a long way behind Kingswood's £18 and Free Passes in London, but a start at least.

RURAL AREAS LOCAL PLAN - This may sound boring and tedious, but it will affect YOU. Over the next 10 years, Northavon District Council has got to find land in the "rural areas" (everywhere except Yate, Chipping Sodbury, Thornbury and the North Fringe) for 800 - 1,100 houses. Pucklechurch has been protected from further development by the Green Belt that surrounds it, but this is being reviewed as well. There is going to be development at Lyde Green anyway so it is VITAL that YOU make YOUR views known to the District Council.

DO YOU THINK THAT THERE SHOULD NOT BE ANY MORE DEVELOPMENT IN PUCKLECHURCH?

DO YOU WANT ANY MORE HOUSES BUILT IN PUCKLECHURCH?

If you do not express your views NOW it will be assumed that you don't care!

The Parish Council Annual Meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 20th May at 8pm - that will be an excellent opportunity to express your opinions. YOUR RATES - will drop through your letter box very soon! They are divided into three parts:

PARISH RATE - has gone up from 2.7p to 3.1p in the pound rateable value. A small increase to maintain and improve services.

DISTRICT RATE - which has increased from 14.8p to 17p in the pound. That is an increase of 14.9%. It would have been 18.2% had it not been for some last minute suggestions from Alliance Councillors! The reason for this large increase is partly that the District Council has approved increased spending on Travel Tokens, Grass Cutting etc, but mostly it is because of a cut in the amount of money that the Government gives to "shire Districts". Northavon has come particularly badly under the new Government rules, not because we are overspenders, but just because of the way the sums have been calculated.

COUNTY RATE - has increased from 190.6p to 224.7p in the £ rateable value. An increase of 17.9% which would have been 25% under the Labour Party proposals which were slashed by the Alliance and Conservative Councillors on Avon. It is still a large increase and much of it is due to cuts in Government grant to the County.

Isn't it time we found a better and fairer way of paying for local services?

While rehearsals for "Tomb with a View" are going on, those not involved with this production are having a lot of fun and have organised Theatre trips, quizzes and speakers.

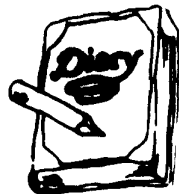
These Thursday evening sessions are now open to non-members at a charge of 50p.
