Finally, Revel will soon be here (Revel Day - 18 June). Please support the events - as a previous chairman of Revel once said "Revel is what makes living in Pucklechurch special" - it certainly gives you a great feeling of community spirit. Above all enjoy it!

As you will see, we have now put a set charge of 20p on Pucklechurch News, which we hope you will still consider good value. Just lately we have been finding it difficult to make ends meet. Over the last ten years everything else has gone up, but lots of people still put only 10p or even less in the tin. On the other hand some people are very generous and put 50p in.

We thought therefore that it would be best to regularise things and have a set charge per copy. If everyone pays 20p we will hopefully cover our costs - approximately £60 per issue. Apart from sponsorship from the Parish Council for the Village Directory (so that it could be delivered free of charge to every house in the Parish) we receive no other income.

Marilyn was recently invited to speak at an Avon Local Councils Association seminar on Village Newsletters and was surprised how complicated some newsletter committees make it. Many receive regular grants from their Parish Councils as well as charging 35p and receiving advertising revenue! We think you get good value for money!

Some of our plans will begin to take effect over the next few weeks (e.g. "Open House") but most will be part of our Stewardship Programme: "The Future in Our Hands" and this will get under way after the summer. Our Christian life at St Thomas' is on the move!

### DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT - Marilyn Palmer

I have now completed one year on Northavon District Council. It has been an interesting year and I have gained a greater insight into the workings of the Council, but there is still much to learn!

As you will be aware, those areas of the village who used to have their dustbins collected on a Tuesday now have them collected on a MONDAY. This is on a one year only basis until the results of the competitive tendering procedures are known.

I mentioned in an earlier report that I had had a RADON detector installed in my home. (When Radon itself decays solid radioactive materials are produced which attach to dust particles in the air and are inhaled.) The detector has now been taken away for analysis - I will let you know the results when I have them.

Most of the queries I have received over the past year have either related to planning applications or to council housing.

#### The Waiting List for Council Houses & Bungalows

There are 14 people on the waiting list for houses in Pucklechurch and 20 on the waiting list for bungalows. I get many enquiries about how people are allocated Council houses or bungalows, so I shall try to explain.

When a house becomes vacant (which is not very often) it is allocated to whoever is on the waiting list, who has the greatest number of 'points' and who has the greatest housing need. The first priority goes to people who the Council have to house BY LAW. These include homeless people and those who live in tied agricultural houses. Sometimes these applicants get in before people who have been on the waiting list for years.

When a bungalow becomes vacant there is usually a time before the keys are actually returned to the Council, then the bungalow is cleaned and re-decorated if necessary (that takes some time as well!). When the bungalow is ready the Lettings Office at Northavon and I look at the waiting list. Many factors are taken into account - how long the person has been on the list, what sort of conditions do they live in at present, and perhaps most important of all, are there any medical reasons why they should be rehoused. All these factors are equally important and occasionally someone who has not been on the list very long, gets rehoused because of medical reasons or because they live in dreadful conditions (outside toilet etc). The Lettings Office and I try to be as fair as possible, but inevitably there will be people who are disappointed. Until the Council builds more bungalows in Pucklechurch, this will be a perpetual problem.

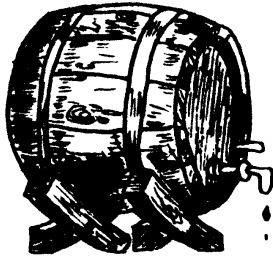

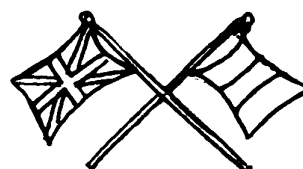
