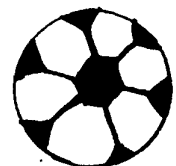
Then we lost away to Winterbourne 3-2 Martin getting both goals.

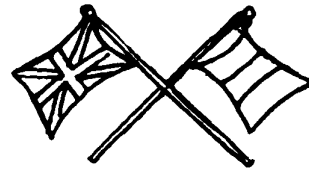
As the audited accounts were not ready in time for the Annual General Meeting, it was agreed at that meeting that they should be published in Pucklechurch News - so here they are!

### DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT - Marilyn Palmer

Just a very brief District Council report this time - as I type P.News I can see that space is very limited in this issue.

P.R.C. HOMES - the Assistant Director of Housing at Northavon D.C. has been trying this week to find a venue to meet the residents of Poplar Drive and part of Homefield on 8th December. Residents will be informed of the arrangements. If anyone has any difficulty in getting to the meeting (wherever it might be) please ring me on Abson 3761 and I will be happy to help with transport. (It will be in Pucklechurch.)

The Environment Committee on Northavon are considering the introduction of "Wheelie Bins" - large, lightweight plastic dustbins with built in wheels, which hold the equivalent of approximately 2½ times a dustbin. One of the advantages would be that the contents of split black bags would not be deposited over our roads.

Along with other members of the Parish Council, I spent a recent Sunday afternoon walking around the Cattybrook Brickworks land at Shortwood, and discussing the implications of Ibstock Bricks' planning application to build a new brickworks there. Ibstock are discussing with the Highways Authority the possibility of changing the route of the proposed by-pass at Shortwood. Shortwood residents have formed an action committee to oppose the plans.

We await with interest the decision of the High Court in London. The case is due to start on 12 December and expected to last three days. I will keep you informed of the outcome.
