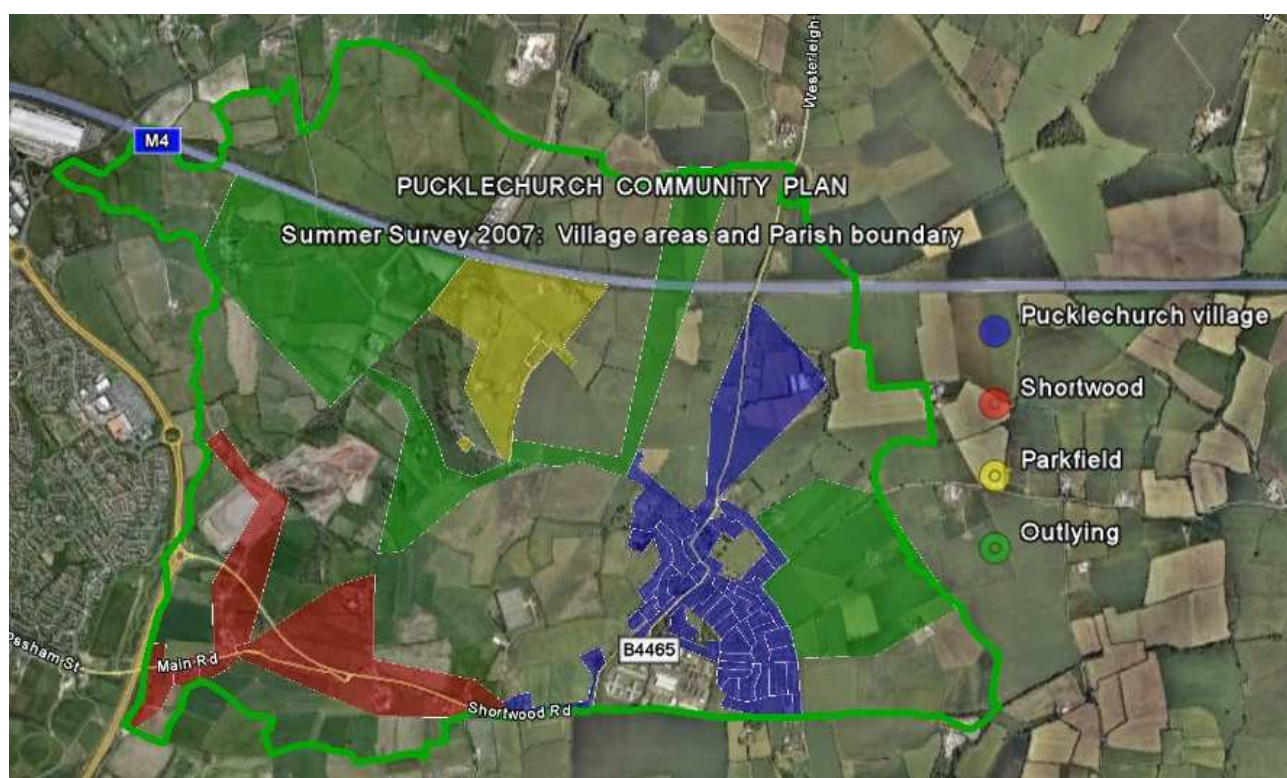

Text responses and Comments

Text responses, whether prompted or not, were recorded from each questionnaire. Comments made but not asked for in the question are shown under *Extra Text*.

It was intended that such unprompted comments should appear within “ “ if written on the questionnaire by the respondent, or without quotes if made (usually for clarification) on data entry or analysis. However, please forgive: the use of quotes often not being that discriminate, text not always appearing in the intended columns, and little effort has been made to correct upper/lower case errors on data entry!

Dots ... indicate where text has been omitted in an attempt to avoid causing offence or to preserve the anonymity of the respondent or household.

Answered this question

A question is counted as *Answered* if one or more prompted for responses (tick, number or text) have been made in a questionnaire, but a question is not counted as *Answered* if the only response is an unprompted for comment recorded as *Extra Text*.

Missing questions

Unfortunately, a few of the Individual questionnaires were distributed with a missing page or blank page side, not allowing 17 respondents to answer from 3 to 6 questions. This affected responses to 38 questions on 10 different page sides, from 11 collection Rounds and all 4 village areas. In the worst cases:

The same 4 questions (Q16-19) were missing in 4 questionnaires from Pucklechurch village (0.38% of the 1055 Individual questionnaires returned from Pucklechurch village)
3 of which were from respondents in the same 75 - 84 age group (2.9% of the 104 returned from that age group in the whole parish)
and 3 of which were from the same Round 3 (10% of the 30 returned from that Round).

The same 6 questions (Q39-44) were missing from 3 questionnaires (0.24% of the 1273 Individual questionnaires returned from the whole parish) from 3 different Rounds, village areas (not Shortwood) and age groups.

For Shortwood:

The same 4 questions (Q62-65) were missing in 2 questionnaires from Round 39 (1.8% of the 110 Individual questionnaires returned from Shortwood
5.3% of the 38 returned from that Round)
both of which were from respondents in the same 25 - 44 age group.

A further 4 questions were (Q58-61) were missing from another Round 39 questionnaire in Shortwood.

The rest of this report analyses the responses in the 64 Household and 110 Individual questionnaires returned from Shortwood i.e. from Delivery/Collection Rounds 20.1, 20.2, 39 and 42 only, as previously defined on page 5.

Office comment : This was apparently the most misunderstood question. Rather than entering the number of people in each age group in the relevant boxes, 44 of the Household questionnaires were returned with a tick, cross or a number in the 0 - 4 or 5 - 11 box only. **As it is unlikely that a child or children under 12 years of age were living alone, these responses were not counted.** Possible reasons why this question was misinterpreted:

Perhaps respondents marked the box to represent the number of people in the household;
 or just the number of children in the age groups were indicated; adults not wanting to reveal their age;
 or may be in some cases a Household questionnaire was filled in for an individual only, rather than for the household.

Although the responses with a tick, cross or number in the 0 - 4 or 5 - 11 box only have not been counted in the above analysis, the responses were recorded and are included under *Extra Text* in the table below:
